Joan Miró was born in Spain in 1893 and died in 1938. He is considered to be one of the most versatile masters of 20th century art; he is often described as a Spanish Surrealist, but he is actually many different artists in one. He includes many symbols or objects from his life in Spain in his paintings, and his works often have a playful or humorous quality to them.
